

Rules Of The Rosholt Area Thresherman Antique Tractor Pull

1. For Antique I, Tractors must be 1938 or older. For Antique II, Tractors must be 1939 thru 1955, with natural aspiration, using no shift on the go. Any tractor in question as to year of manufacture, must have serial number in proper location and must be read easily. Tractors must have stock blocks and no external parts manufactured for Tractors built later than year 1938 for Antique I, or 1955 for Antique II. Any Tractor having a serial number or parts to make a newer Tractor appear legal will be disqualified.
2. Anyone caught tampering with another person's Tractor will be disqualified from pulling.
3. Tractors must have basic factory wheel height sizes. (No downsized front ends, no oversized rear wheels.)
4. Tractors must be wheel driven, no crawlers or dual wheels.
5. Original steel wheels will be allowed to pull where permitted. Steel wheels shall pull last in class. One set of original equipment extension rims is allowed.
6. Tractors will be divided into the following weight classes: Antique I—(3200 (20H.P. or less), 3500, 4000) maximum tire size: 14.9(4500, 5000) maximum tire size: 15.5, (6000, 7000 pounds and 12,000) maximum tire size: 18.4 Antique II--- 3000 (25 H.P. or less, 13.6 maximum tire size), 4000 – 14.9 tire size, 5000 – 15.5 tire size, 6000, 7000 pounds and 12,000 – 18.4 tire size.
7. Maximum two pulls per tractor.
8. Rigid draw bar must not exceed 20 inches in height, nor can be closer than 18 inches from the center line of the rear axle.
9. Tractors will be stopped if the front end raises higher than the track Judge decides is safe.
10. Extra weights must not exceed beyond 24 inches behind the center rear axle. Weights must not interfere with the hook-up. No weights are to be ahead of the front wheels for Antique I and for Antique II the front weights shall not extend more than 24 inches beyond the center of the front frames outmost casting.
11. Extra weights must be securely fastened to the tractor. If anything falls off before the pin is pulled, the tractor will be disqualified.
12. Any gas operated tractor must use gasoline only.
13. Engine speed must be controlled by the throttle lever and a functional stock governor only. No strings, wires or foot feeds allowed. Decision of the track Judge is final.
14. Tractors must be operated in a safe manner at all times. Speed must not exceed 3 M.P.H. on or off the track.
15. Drivers must be 14 years of age or older (drivers between 14 and 18 must have written consent of parent at each pull.)
16. While pulling the driver must remain on the seat (if so equipped) with one hand on the wheel. No jumping or bouncing will be allowed, however leaning will be allowed.
17. Tractors must stop immediately upon red flag signal from the judge or be disqualified. If the track Judge stops a puller for any reason the puller takes the distance where he stopped except if it is the first ten feet. He is then entitled to a restart.
18. Only one pull allowed per tractor in each class unless the track Judge rules otherwise or if a tie is declared in the top placing tractors. If disqualification is ruled on top placing tractor, all other tractors moves up one place.
19. Any tractor violating the track boundary will be disqualified.
20. The decision of the track Judge and Rosholt Area Thresherman Officer will be final on areas of dispute not covered in these rules.
